



### Intermediate to Paramedic Transition Course

The Intermediate will be evaluated and accepted into the program with Paramedic Director Approval.

The Intermediate will be required to attend, either in classroom or hybrid, EMS 227, EMS 227L, EMS 229, EMS 229L, EMS 233, EMS 233L, and pass course written examinations and skills check offs.

The Intermediate will be required to complete EMTS 280 and EMTS 281, either by proctor examination attesting that the candidate possesses or demonstrates the Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities (KSA) of an entry-level Paramedic, or completion of 120 hours of field experience with 20 calls as lead paramedic with proctor approval.

The Intermediate will be required to take the National Registry Practical examination in order to obtain Paramedic certification.

The Intermediate will be required to prepare and maintain the NREMT Paramedic Portfolio during the course.

### RN to Paramedic Transition

The RN will be evaluated and accepted into the program with Paramedic Director Approval.

The RN will be required to pass a Course Challenge Written Exam for EMS 227, EMS 231, and EMS 235.

The RN will be required to pass a Course Challenge Skills Check-off EMS 227L, EMS 231L, and EMS 235L.

The RN will be required to complete 50 clinical hours in an Emergency Department or Intensive Care setting, unless the candidate has documented experience in either of those areas. The RN will be required to complete EMS 280 and EMS 281 either by proctor examination attesting that the candidate possesses the Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities (KSA) of an entry-level Paramedic, or shows completion of 120 hours of field experience with 20 calls as lead paramedic and proctor approval.

The RN will be required to take the National Registry Practical examination in order to obtain Paramedic certification. The RN will be required to prepare and maintain the NREMT Paramedic Portfolio during the course.

*THC (marijuana) is part of the required 10-panel drug screen prior to admittance into any Health Professions or Public Safety program at WCCC. The passage of Amendment 64 in the State of Colorado, does not overrule Federal law, which states this is still an illegal substance. Students testing positive for THC (marijuana) will not be allowed entrance or re-entrance into a Public Safety program.*
